# **EVERLASTING TAJ**

16th September, 2012 (Sunday)

Delhi / Agra / Delhi

By Road

**0600 hrs** Morning depart Delhi by surface for Agra (200 kms / 5 hrs)



**1100** hrs Arrive Agra & visit - - Taj Mahal . Taj Mahal is one of the seven wonders of the world . IT is a UNESCO world heritage site. It was built in 1630 by the Mughal Emperor Shah Jahan in memory of his deceased wife, Mumtaz Mahal to enshrine her mortal remains. The monument has been described as the most extravagant ever built for love, for the emperor was heart-broken when Mumtaz, to whom he had been married for 17 years, died in 1629 in childbirth soon after delivering her 14<sup>th</sup> child. **Taj Mahal Closed on Every Friday.** 

1400 hrs Lunch at Five Star Hotel.

**1500** hrs Visit Agra Fort - the seat and the stronghold of the Mughal Empire under successive generations. This was the seat of Mughal rule and administration and the present structure owes its origins to Akbar who erected the walls and gates and the first buildings on the eastern banks of Yamuna River. Shah Jehan added the impressive quarters and the mosque while Aurangzeb added the outer ramparts. Visit its Hall of Public Audience and its Royal Pavilions.

**1600 hrs** After that return to Delhi by surface (200 kms/5 hrs)

2100 hrs Arrive Delhi.
