Message from the President

A recent position statement released by ASMBS on weight bias and stigma highlights the increasing weight-based discrimination towards individuals with adiposity-based diseases. This negative attitude perceived by patients may cause them to be reluctant to seek general healthcare or help. The forms of discrimination highlighted in this paper posing as barriers include disrespectful treatment, negative attitudes of health providers, unsolicited advice to lose weight, embarrassment of being weighed and medical equipment too small to be functional. As such these individuals are not seeking medical intervention for their age-appropriate cancer screenings resulting in delays in detection of breast, gynaecological and colorectal cancers

Hence it highlights our mission: we must continue our communication, interaction, education, sensitivity training and competency to all healthcare providers globally to provide universal standards of care for individuals with adiposity-based diseases.

Psychological support to patients undergoing bariatric surgery is extremely important too. IFSO has recently endorsed BOMSS guidelines that describe service models for the delivery of psychological support pre-surgery and 6 to 9 months post-surgery involving online resources, group workshops and face-to-face consultations. The guidelines recognise that interventions for patients with less complex needs may be provided by upskilled, and suitably supervised, staff. Those with more complex needs should have access to a psychologist within the bariatric surgery service. IFSO has endorsed these guidelines recognising the significant contribution of psychologists and other integrated health members in supporting patients through their bariatric surgery journey.

As the year 2019 comes to an end, I would like to wish all members Happy Holidays and a Merry Christmas for the festive season.

May 2020 bring Joy, Happiness and Good Health and everything one can wish for all our members.

Last but not least EAES – European Association of Endoscopic Surgeons (sponsor) together with IFSO-EC, EASO – European Association for the Study of Obesity and ESPCOP – European Society for Perioperative Care of the Obese Patient are about finalizing an update of the 2004 EAES guidelines on bariatric surgery.

This update was a difficult task, with more than 20K new papers to be reviewed. To this aim, the GRADE methodology was applied, probably being the first surgical guideline development group (16 experts from different societies) using the GRADEpro platform to summarize evidence. The development and reporting complies with AGREE II standards. The new guidelines will be available/published in the next months.

CONTRIBUTIONS FROM THE NATIONAL SOCIETIES

South African Association for Obesity and Metabolism (SASSO)

SASSO has had the opportunity to reflect on a very successful period for the year of 2019. Two surgeons have reached full accreditation status and been added to the board. In addition, two surgeons have started there their provisional accreditation process. This means that our national tallies for metabolic surgeries have grown to close on 3000, whilst maintaining a mortality of only 0.2 %.

Statistics for the Centers of Metabolic Medicine and Surgery was released during an international congress held in Cape Town during October 2018. The EXCO is continuing our public and media awareness campaigns with SABC2's Bonitas House Calls, Medical Chronical, South African Woman's Health, Sunday Times and various radio stations. Awareness interviews on RSG, the national radio station, have escalated as a result of more than the usual public interest and a high volume of requests to continue the talks. Podcasts are available on our social media. Social media has become a popular tool to educate the public and SASSO has two websites, www.sasso-online.org, www.cemmswaterfallcity.com

Facebook and Instagram links provide excellent exposure where the blogs and newsletters are concerned.

Monthly information sessions became a much needed way to address the requests from the lay public. Two of the bariatric patients are busy with the formalizing of a bariatric recipe book. This promises to be a huge success for bariatric patients as well as correct meal-planning for families.

The board discusses pertinent issues convening through SKYPE meetings and SASSO had their formal board meeting during the recent World Congress on Internal Medicine in Cape Town. The chair of SASSO has also taken care of addressing a number of unacceptable obesity treatment strategies offered to the public. This was done by manner of addressing these strategies both with the media and the medical journals and through our social media links.

Our data base for surgeries conducted at all the centres in the country, has drawn global attention, the CEO of SASSO forms part of the Gender Equality in Bariatric Medicine movement and she serves on their Women's Committee. She also plays a pivotal role in World Obesity's Clinical Care Pathway.

The standardisation of post-surgical replacement packs have been implemented and all National Centers of Excellence for Metabolic Medicine and Surgery in South Africa are aware of the importance of issuing it to patients. The EXCO of SASSO has assisted the Health Profession Council (SA) by giving testimony in a number of cases that required disciplinary hearings. Finally, SASSO is committed to further training and sponsoring of physicians to attend the Congresses relating to Metabolic Medicine to be held in 2019. Accreditation training for surgeons and their clinical teams were well-attended and requests and bookings for the four training sessions that has been confirmed for next year are starting to fill up.

Ongoing efforts to establish a more formal treatment protocol in the tertiary institutions have resulted in a PhD student who have handed in her Protocol at the University of Pretoria in South Africa and is conducting research with preand post-patients in our Centre. This was followed-up by a high-delegation visit from the Faculty of Health Sciences in May 2019. Subsequently approval has been requested that SASSO will provide the first ever Satellite Training Unit that runs under the auspices of the University of Pretoria. Successful discussions with Business Leadership South Africa will result in obtaining a Fellowship in Bariatric Medicine for this Satellite Unit. The Netcare Group will also provide funding for a year to support a second fellowship.

The award ceremony for Ward Hostesses (trained by our bariatric dieticians) in the Netcare Waterfall City Hospital has gained momentum and after three years since its inception this annual ceremony has become the highlight of the year. Those who excel in their year are given a special award – which in turn has given the recipients enormous pride in their strive for excellence.

On October 24-25 2019, the Ukrainian Association of Bariatric Surgery (President Andriy Lavryk, Secretary Andriy Zgonnyk) held a scientific and practical conference with international participation - "New Trends in Surgical Treatment of Obesity and Related Metabolic Disorders".



The aim of the conference was to familiarize doctors with current issues of diagnostics and modern approaches to the treatment of obesity and related metabolic disorders using innovative methods of surgical treatment.

Scientific and practical directions of the conference:

- new perspectives on the etiology and pathogenesis of obesity and associated metabolic disorders;

- discussing the differential approach to the choice of bariatric surgery in patients with obesity and concomitant metabolic disorders;

- consideration of innovative directions in the treatment of obesity;

- live surgery.

Scientists and doctors of various profiles, who deal with obesity problems, were invited to the conference: surgeons, oncologists, obstetricians, endocrinologists, GPs, family doctors, physicians, gastroenterologists, pharmacologists, interns. During the two days of the conference 22 reports were presented at three meetings and 2 live surgery workshops were held. 130 doctors participated in the conference.

American Chapter The primary theme of ObesityWeek this year was Diabetes. Dr. William Cefalu, the current Director of the Division of Diabetes, Endocrinology and Metabolic Diseases (DEM) at the NIDDK, NIH, was the ObesityWeek Keynote Speaker. ASMBS also hosted two



collaborative sessions on diabetes: "<u>Diabetes and the Metabolic Surgeon – How,</u> <u>Who, Where and What?</u>" led by Dr. Ali Aminian, and "<u>Interventional Treatment of</u> <u>Diabetes</u>", a joint session with the American Diabetes Association led by ASMBS Immediate Past President Dr. Eric DeMaria and Dr. William Cefalu. The joint ASMBS/ IFSO *One Anastomosis Metabolic Procedures: Gaining Popularity Around the World. Why Not in the U.S.?* was also extremely well attended.

On Wednesday, November 6, the ASMBS, ASMBS Foundation, and IFSO hosted an International Reception. The reception was a great opportunity for guests who traveled great distances to network with one another. Dr. Haitham Elmaleh for his abstract for *Short-Term Results Of A Randomized Controlled Trial On The Effect Of Laparoscopic One Anastomosis Gastric Bypass Versus Laparoscopic Sleeve Gastrectomy In Treatment Of Obese Type 2 Diabetic Patients*

Minneapolis surgeon Dr. Henry Buchwald receives the 2019 Jacobson Innovation Award of the American College of Surgeons

International award recognizes surgeon's life-long pioneering work and innovative research in metabolic and bariatric surgery.

CHICAGO (June 10, 2019): The 2019 Jacobson Innovation Award of the American College of Surgeons (ACS) was presented to Henry Buchwald, MD, PhD, FACS, at a dinner held in his honor on Friday evening June 7. Dr. Buchwald is a surgeon, researcher, inventor, teacher, and mentor with a career spanning more than five decades as a surgeon scientist.

The prestigious Jacobson Innovation Award honors living surgeons who have been innovators of a new development or technique in any field of surgery and is made possible through a gift from Julius H. Jacobson II, MD, FACS, and his wife Joan. Dr. Jacobson is a general vascular surgeon known for his pioneering work in the development of microsurgery.

Dr. Buchwald was honored with this international surgical award for his life-long pioneering work and innovative research. He is considered a pioneer of metabolic and bariatric surgery, formerly considered a fringe field for obese patients and excluded from mainstream academic surgical practice. Dr. Buchwald helped transform bariatric surgery into a legitimate field of study and application. Today, bariatric surgery is performed in almost every academic medical center and community hospital in the U.S.

Early in his career, while he was a laboratory resident, Dr. Buchwald discovered that the ileum, part of the small intestine, is the primary site for the absorption of cholesterol and bile acids. As a result, he developed the Buchwald Procedure: the partial ileal bypass (PIB) operation, which bypasses part of the ileum to lower cholesterol levels. The PIB procedure was one of the first surgical techniques to treat a metabolic disease and remains the most potent therapy to lower plasma cholesterol levels in humans today.

Among Dr. Buchwald's extensive research accomplishments is a landmark paper in *Circulation* that led to the multi-institutional trial on the surgical management of hyperlipidemias: Program on the Surgical Control of the Hyperlipidemias (POSCH), which received continuous funding from the National Institutes of Health (NIH) from 1973 to 1997. The trial proved the link between cholesterol and heart disease, demonstrating that lowering cholesterol can reduce heart disease and save lives.



Henry Buchwald, MD, PhD, FACS, was presented with the Jacobson Innovation Award on June 7 by ACS President Ronald V. Maier, MD, FACS. Dr. Buchwald was honored with this international surgical award for his life-long pioneering work and innovative research.

Dr. Buchwald has received seven additional NIH grants to study a totally implantable

infusion pump device. He founded a separate bioengineering laboratory to produce the first implantable infusion pump, a novel peritoneovenous shunt, one-way flow catheters, and other devices. He later patented the infusion pump for widespread use in insulin delivery, continuous delivery of chemotherapy, and further applications. He holds 20 patents to his name and was inducted into the Minnesota Inventors Hall of Fame in 1988.

The 53rd annual Surgical Forum at the ACS Clinical Congress was dedicated to Dr. Buchwald as "a true surgeon scientist who, through creativity and perseverance, has made seminal contributions to science and society" and mentored more than 65 surgical residents and trainees. He has received numerous awards and honors, including a tribute in the U.S. Senate Congressional Record in 1991. He has been elected to five presidencies of national and international professional societies.

Report from Hong Kong Society of Metabolic and Bariatric Surgery (HKSMBS)

This is the third year since our society establishment in November 2017. Thanks to the hard work of our council members, our society has achieved the mission of education and promotion of Bariatric Surgery in Hong Kong.



A 3-monthly Clinical Meeting was held in Hong Kong with interesting case presentations and fruitful discussions. On 23rd-24th August 2019, we organized our Second HKSMBS Metabolic & Bariatric Surgery Workshop 2019 at the Minimally Invasive Surgical Skill Center, Prince of Wales Hospital. We invited Prof. R Kosai from Malaysia, Prof. CK Huang from Taiwan, and Dr. H Liang, Prof. Yong Wang and Ms Xiaomei Chen from China. It is a 2 days program with lectures and pig-model Hands -On workshop. We had 35 candidates registered included our members and doctors from China.



Moreover, on 9th November 2019, we have organized our first HKSMBS Annual Scientific Meeting at Kowloon Shangri La Hotel. We have invited Prof Asim Shabbir from Singapore as our overseas Guest speaker. On the same meeting, we have announced our first HKSMBS position statement on "Indication of Metabolic & bariatric surgical procedure" and our official Launch of Website www.hksmbs.org . Moreover, young surgeons from 6 HK hospital has presented their scientific paper during the ASM and Dr Eric Cheung from North District Hospital has won the Best Paper award.

Report from JSTO

The **37th Annual Meeting of the Japanese Society for Treatment of Obesity** (JSTO) was held in conjunction with the **40th Annual Meeting of Japan Society for the Study of Obesity (JASSO**) in Tokyo, <u>November 2-3, 2019</u>. The JASSO has mainly focused on internal medicine aspects and basic research in obesity. The JSTO has mainly focused on the surgical treatment of patients with morbid obesity. This is the first joint meeting of these two societies and the aim is to collaborate to enhance the comprehensive treatment of obesity and related diseases in Japan. The meeting included 18 symposia (including an international symposium), 40 oral presentations, 26 poster sessions, 2 special lectures (Professors David E. Cummings and Peter Arner), a Japan-Korea-Taiwan joint meeting, and other sessions. As a result of this meeting, about 2000 participants recognize the aims of the medical/ scientific and surgical societies for the treatment of patients with obesity and confirmed the role of bariatric/metabolic surgery in Japan.

In order to cover the various activities of the Scientific Committee, the membership has been enlarged, keeping a good balance among the geographical areas.

Among the activities in progress. Sections on Laparoscopic Adjustable Gastric Banding, Roux-en-Y Gastric Bypass and Sleeve Gastrectomy are being updated, a section on Single anastomosis Duodeno-Ileal Bypass with Sleeve Gastrectomy is under development and a task force in-charged of a Position Statement on Robotic Bariatric Surgery is actively working on it.

In addition, in order to learn more on the One Anastomosis Gastric Bypass, a survey is in progress.

Plans for the 2020 IFSO meeting in Miami are very advanced. In close collaboration with the IFSO-LAC and ASMBS, an attractive program has been planned to cover the most important and controversial topics of Bariatric & Metabolic Surgery. Bariatric Metabolic Endoscopy Committee

Barham Abu-Dayyeh Chair of the Bariatric Metabolic Endoscopy Committee

The Bariatric and Metabolic Endoscopy Committee has been working diligently to synthesis and incorporate evidence-based clinical algorithms and pathways into the practice of bariatric and metabolic endoscopy.

To that end, we embarked on series of initiatives using systematic review and metaanalyses methodology to create evidence-based clinical algorithms for the management of post bariatric surgery complications.

The first systematic review and meta-analysis dealing with endoscopic approaches to post bariatric surgery strictures and stenosis is completed.

We are starting another systematic review and meta-analysis for the management of leaks and fistula after bariatric surgery.

Furthermore, we will be focusing on understanding the physiologic and clinical impact of bariatric surgery on upper gastrointestinal physiology and gastroesophageal reflux disease.

Ultimately, our work will venture into creation of benchmarks and best-practice consensus guidelines for primary bariatric and metabolic endoscopic interventions.
